Program Overview

The Fourth Middle East Lung Cancer Congress, Nursing Symposium, offers evidence-based updates on important concepts related to pharmacological, medical, and psycho-social issues in lung cancer. The symposium will shed light on oncologic emergencies encountered with patients with lung cancer. In addition, we will explore the latest updates in the guidelines for the management of chemotherapy induced nausea and vomiting. Furthermore, the program will discuss the negative and positive aspects that affect the decision-making process in families living with lung cancer. Finally, the program will explore the mental health issues that patients face throughout their trajectory of the lung cancer.
